HINS Letter from the Principal

We want to take a moment to congratulate our partners in education, Henderson County Schools (HCS). You may have seen the school system's recent posts regarding their performance on the Kentucky Summative Assessment (KSA).

Many of you may be wondering, "How did HNS do on this assessment? Where are our scores?" HNS students do not take the KSA. As members of the Diocese of Owensboro school system we assess our students' progress and growth three times a year with the NWEA MAP test. This test provides us with information on student progress to guide our instruction throughout the year. It also projects how our students would perform on the KSA if they were to take it. Please see the chart below to learn how HNS compares to Kentucky state performance and Henderson County performance. The data shared in this chart shows HNS students' projected "Proficient and Distinguished" performance on the state assessment based on NWEA alignment and linking studies. These performance categories are defined by the state and are specific to Kentucky. The chart also shares HNS MAP Testing data from the Spring 2023 testing window.

We are excited and proud to recognize our hard working students for performing at a high level. Way to go Cardinals! Keep up the good work!





ISSUES WITH EMAIL COMMUNICATION



Due to a recent change within the FACTS phone/email communication system there has been a significant increase in HNS communications being sent to junk or spam. Be sure to check your junk/spam folder and follow the steps below to help prevent communication issues in the future!

- Yahoo- Click on the spam folder, put a check mark next to the email and then click "Not Spam"
- **Gmail** Click on the spam folder, put a check mark next to the email and then click "Not Spam"
- **Hotmail** Click on the Junk Email folder, highlight the email and check the box next to it. On the right side of the screen a message will appear that says "This message was identified as junk. We'll delete it after 4 days." Click the link that says "It's not junk". You will then be prompted to "Add to safe senders", click OK.
- Outlook- Click on the Junk Email folder, right click the email, highlight "Junk", then select "Not Junk"

SCHOOL ARRIVAL REMINDERS

- The school doors open at 7:00 AM.
- The school day starts promptly at 7:55 am. Students that are not seated and ready to begin their day at 7:55 are considered tardy.
- In the event that a student accumulates 8 unexcused tardies, parents will be contacted and the student will meet with the school counselor to discuss the issue of tardiness and how to prevent future tardies.
- In the event that a student accumulates 10 or more tardies, families will be notified to appear before the attendance board unless they provide a valid excuse for the tardies.
 Additional noncompliance may result in the family being referred to a Henderson county Court designated worker.
- When pulling into the alley off of First Street families with students in the Early Learning Program should pull to the right side of the alley and families with students in grades K-8 should pull to the left side of the alley (unless otherwise directed by a school employee).
- Please do not allow your child(ren) to exit the vehicle until inside the coned area.
- Students should exit from the **passenger side** and enter the school through the office doors (K-8) or Early Learning Doors (PS and PK).
- Parents should follow instructions from staff directing traffic; the staff members are in place to ensure the safety of all children.
- To promote a safe environment, refrain from using cell phones during student drop off.



SAFETY & WINTER WEATHER

The safety and security of your children is at the forefront of daily school activities. The staff routinely evaluates school procedures to maintain as safe a building as is possible for your children. Regardless of whether it is in the parking lot for dismissal, a spilled water bottle in the hallway, severe weather, or a security concern, they are continually watching and working to ensure a safe environment. Throughout the year the staff has very pointed conversations and practices procedures for the possibility of unsafe events: fire drills, earthquake drills, tornado drills, and secure classroom drills. In addition to being prepared while at school, the decisions related to attending



school during instances of inclement weather are taken just as seriously. As winter weather approaches information relative to HNS families and their safety will be gathered before making a decision to close school. If a descision to close school is made it will be communicated via text alert and information on the availability of child care will be included.
