NOTES FROM THE NURSE

It's that time of year again, lots of holiday happenings and fun. Unfortunately, it is also the time when we see increases in respiratory illnesses. Strep, flu and COVID have made quite the appearance lately and RSV is likely lurking somewhere close.

Many if not most of these viruses are spread not only through sharing close air space, but especially through cross contamination via surfaces (coughing, sneezing etc. and droplets getting on hands and surfaces and then cross contaminating ourselves by rubbing eyes, noses, mouths etc). Frequent hand hygiene and surface disinfection of frequently touched items and shared items can really help reduce the spread.

Remember children with fever from viral illnesses, need to remain out until they are fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications. If your child has COVID or flu, talk with your healthcare provider about when best to return or feel free to reach out to the school nurse. Even without fever, make sure your child has controllable secretions and coughs and understands how to cover their coughs. A child that doesn't feel well, does not learn well either, and they potentially cause other children to become ill and miss school.

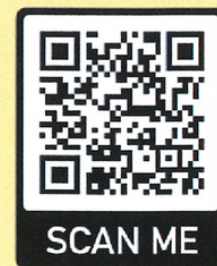
When – Saturday, January 13, 2024 – Doors open at 7:30 AM
